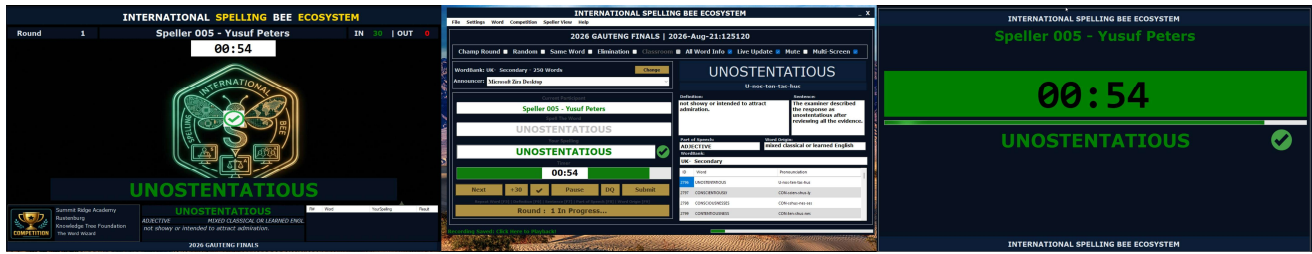

About This Guide

This standalone guide explains how to configure, use and manage the International Spelling Bee Ecosystem. It combines learning workflows, WordBank management, targeted study, formal competition operation, multi-screen presentation, audio evidence and post-event reporting.

IMPORTANT TERMINOLOGY A name entered on the Learning start screen is a session and leaderboard name, not a permanent learner profile. Separate Windows user accounts are required when separate private databases and statistics are needed.

BEFORE YOU START Confirm the required edition, approved WordBank, Windows Text-to-Speech voice and signed-in Windows user. Competition operators must also verify participant data, microphone input and display connections.

Quick Start: Learning Edition

1. Open the International Spelling Bee Ecosystem and select the Learning Edition.
2. Enter the participant or session name. Remember that this identifies the current session and leaderboard entry; it does not create a separate learner database.
3. Choose the activity: Learn, Practice, Test or Individual Speed Round.
4. Set the time limit and, where applicable, the maximum number of words. Spelling Level is used only for leaderboard grouping.
5. Choose Text-to-Speech or Silent – Manual for a human announcer.
6. Open the activity and select the required WordBank. Use Advanced Filter when a targeted study set is needed.
7. Complete the activity, review the result or session report, and use Word Statistics to identify the next words to study.

Quick Start: Competition Edition

- Connect the microphone and confirm that the application detects it. Speak normally and verify that the volume meter moves.
- Connect the required external displays and set Windows to Extend these displays. Open the Speller and Audience views and place each window on the correct screen.
- Open the Competition Edition, enter a clear competition name, select the delivery method and set the timer.
- Add participants manually or import the approved spreadsheet. Review names, participant order and authorised profile information before starting.
- Start the competition, select the approved WordBank and verify the competition-rule toggles.
- Select Next to present the word. Capture the spelling exactly as announced or use the permitted adjudication control, then select Submit.
- At the end of each round, verify active and eliminated totals, resolve eligible challenges and start the next round.
- When the competition is complete, open Previous Competition Results and export the comprehensive report. Retain the report and required audio records.

Competition Operator Pre-Start Check

- Approved participant order and authorised display information confirmed.
- Competition name, time limit, delivery method and rules confirmed.
- Approved WordBank selected and representative pronunciations tested.
- Microphone detected and live volume movement visible.
- Adjudicator, Speller and Audience screens placed on the intended displays.
- Audience privacy, video and sponsor presentation checked.
- Report location, recording location and available storage confirmed.

Essential Controls During a Competition

Control	Quick use
Next	Presents the next word and advances to the next active speller.
Submit	Finalises the captured spelling and applies the configured result rules.
+30	Adds 30 seconds when authorised by the competition rules.
Pause	Stops progression while an authorised review or interruption is handled.
DQ	Records an exceptional disqualification and requires a factual reason.

Control	Quick use
Playback Last Word	Replays the latest saved attempt when an immediate review is required.
Challenge Elimination	Restores an eligible speller eliminated during the round that has just ended.

If Something Is Not Ready

Issue	Immediate action
No microphone detected	Connect or enable the device, then confirm that Windows detects it.
Microphone detected but meter does not move	Check mute, input level and the selected Windows input device.
Additional display is missing	Reconnect the display and confirm that Windows is using Extend, not Duplicate.
Wrong content appears on a display	Move the Speller or Audience window to the intended monitor using the screen controls.

IMPORTANT Do not reset the database as a troubleshooting shortcut. Reset Database removes learning progress and statistics and, in the Competition Edition, can remove existing competition records.

CHAPTER 2

Getting Started

Configure a learning session or prepare a competition from the correct start screen.

Learning Start Screen

Figure 2.1 - Learning start screen: choose the mode, session name, timing, word count, leaderboard level and delivery method.

Control	What it does
Participant Full Name	Identifies the current session and leaderboard entry only. It does not create a permanent profile.
Time Limit per Word/Round	Applies per word where relevant; in Individual Speed Round it applies to the entire round.
Maximum Words	Sets the number of words in Test Mode.
Spelling Level	Groups leaderboard statistics only. It does not select a harder list and may be left blank.
Word Delivery Method	Choose Text-to-Speech or Silent - Manual for a human announcer.
WordBank	Selected after the activity opens; the WordBank determines the words and practical difficulty.

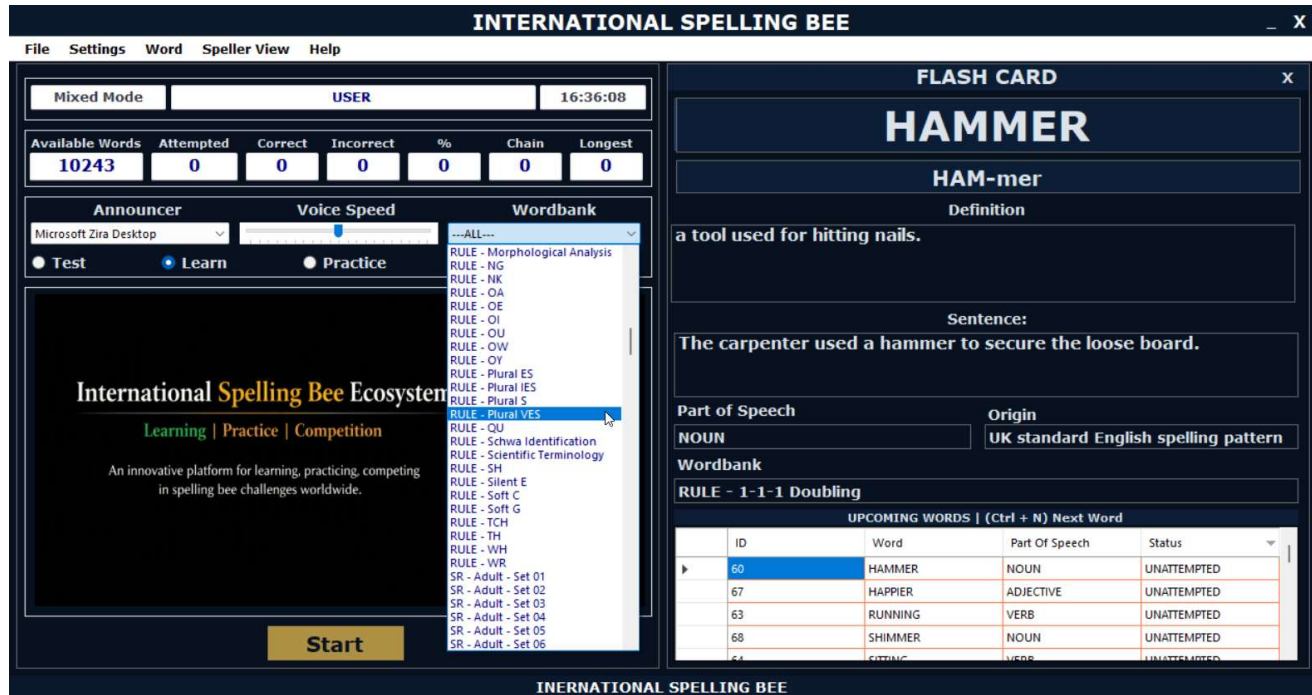


Figure 2.2 – Wordbank Selection Screen before starting any activity.

Windows User Data Separation

The application stores learning data in the database associated with the Windows user currently signed in. Different session names used under the same Windows account contribute to the same word statistics. Use a separate Windows user account for each learner who requires private progress records and targeted learning statistics.

IMPORTANT Changing the participant name does not create a separate statistics database. Windows user accounts provide the data separation.

Competition Start Screen

Figure 2.2 - Competition start screen: start or resume an event, select delivery and timing, verify microphone readiness and load participants.

Control	Practical guidance
Competition Name	Use a clear, unique event name for local folders, history and reports.
Previous Competitions	Resume an in-progress competition or access previous results. Use the same timer as the original event.
Word Delivery Method	Text-to-Speech announces the word; Silent - Manual allows a human pronouncer. Audio is recorded in either case.
Microphone Status	Shows whether a microphone has been detected.
Volume Level	Movement confirms that audio is reaching the application. If detected but stationary, check mute and input settings.
Manual Entry / Import	Add participants individually or import up to 999 using the supplied spreadsheet.

MICROPHONE READINESS If Microphone Ready is shown and the volume meter moves with speech, no separate test recording is normally required.

CHAPTER 3

WordBanks and Word Management

Build high-quality study and competition data before selecting a learning mode.

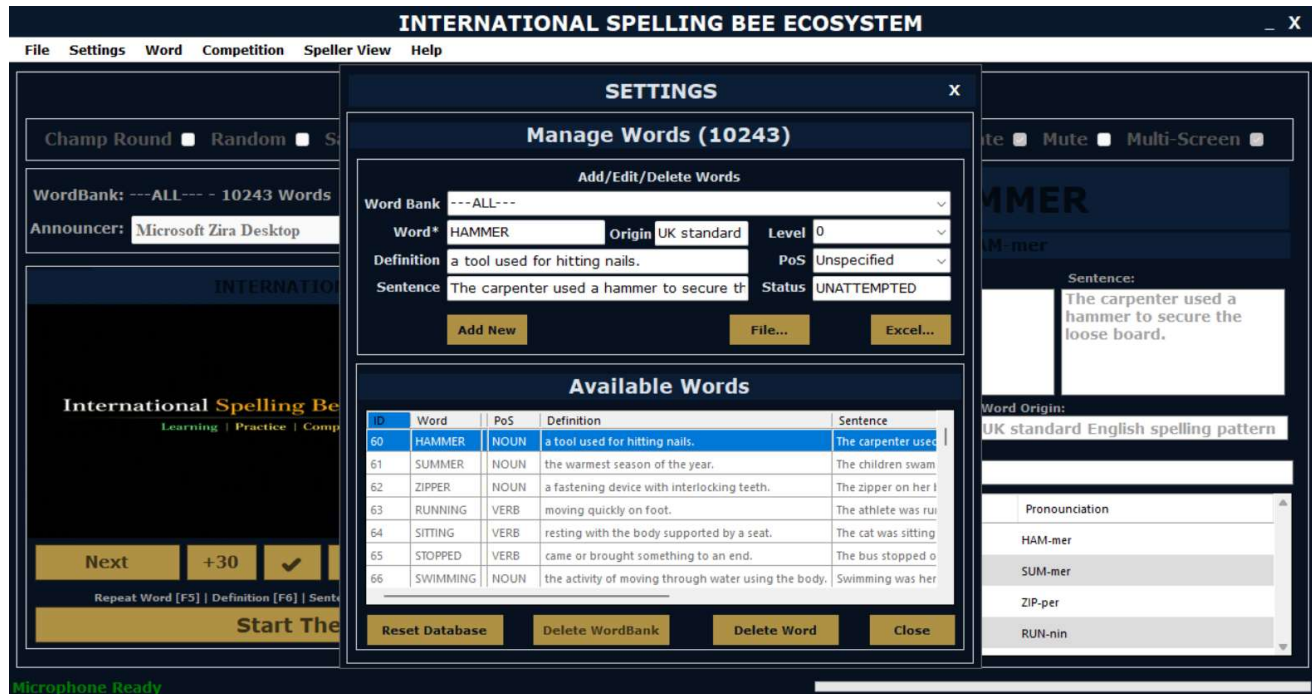


Figure 3.1 - WordBank Management. Create, import, edit, delete and reset WordBanks while maintaining definitions, sentences, origin, level, part of speech, status and pronunciation information.

Starter Word Disclaimer

The application includes more than 10,000 carefully selected starter words to demonstrate the ecosystem and help users begin immediately. These words are not the definitive list for a particular school, curriculum or competition. Users and organisers are responsible for importing, reviewing and maintaining the words they intend to use.

British and American spellings are used interchangeably. Most supplied WordBanks carry a UK or US prefix. Competition organisers must select one approved spelling standard and remove confusing alternatives where required.

Importing and Maintaining Words

- Use the provided spreadsheet template for bulk import.
- Review spelling, definition, sentence, pronunciation guide, origin, part of speech and language variant.
- Remove duplicate or alternative spellings that could create ambiguity.
- Test representative words in the intended voice and competition mode.
- Delete unneeded WordBanks from Word Management to reduce selection errors.

CHAPTER 4

Spelling Rules and Advanced Filter

Turn large collections into structured lessons built around patterns, roots and learner performance.

What Is a Spelling Rule?

A spelling rule is a recurring pattern that helps explain or predict how words are written. Rules reduce reliance on memorisation by grouping words according to letter patterns, suffixes, roots, word origins and spelling conventions. Rules have exceptions, so the aim is informed pattern recognition rather than assuming every word behaves identically.

Rule or pattern	Explanation	Examples
1-1-1 doubling	A one-syllable word ending in one vowel plus one consonant usually doubles the final consonant before a vowel suffix.	run -> running; hop -> hopping
Drop the final e	A silent final e is commonly dropped before a suffix beginning with a vowel.	make -> making; use -> using
CK after a short vowel	CK commonly represents /k/ after a short vowel in a one-syllable word.	back; neck; pick
IE/EI pattern	Many words use ie, while ei commonly follows c; exceptions still require study.	field; receive; ceiling
Greek PH	Greek-derived words often use ph for the /f/ sound.	phonics; photograph; pharmacy
British -ise/-isation	British spellings may use s where American spellings frequently use z.	organise; generalisation
French origin	French-derived words may preserve less predictable letter patterns or endings.	ballet; buffet; silhouette
Compound words	Two complete words combine to form one word.	sunlight; football; toothpaste

Two Ways to Study Rules

Method 1: select a supplied RULE WordBank, such as doubling, silent-letter, suffix, Greek-root or British-spelling collections. Method 2: use Advanced Filter to create a dynamic rule set from several WordBanks without building a new collection.

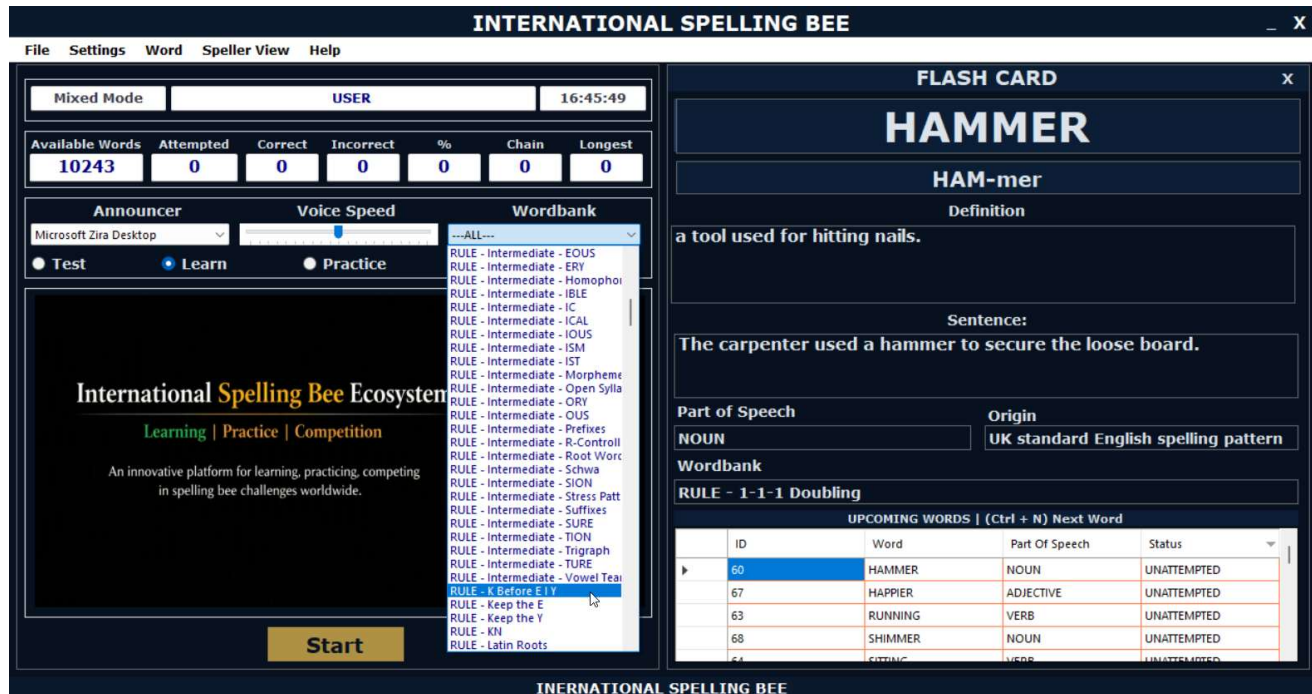


Figure 4.1 – Preloaded Spelling Rules selection from the WordBank Menu.

Figure 4.2 – Advanced Filter combining word length, letter sequences, WordBank, level, part of speech, status, origin and sort order to create targeted study sets.

Filter	Examples
Word Length	= 8, > 10, >= 12, < 6 or <= 5
Starts With	Prefixes and initial sequences such as anti, pre, trans or geo
Contains	Patterns such as ph, ie, ei, tion or double consonants
Ends With	Suffixes such as tion, sion, cious, ous, ise or ize
Excluding	Remove selected letters or sequences
WordBank	Use one or multiple collections
Part of Speech / Origin	Build grammatical or etymological sets
Status	Target UNATTEMPTED, LEARNED, PRACTISED, CORRECT or INCORRECT words

Example Filter Recipes

- Greek PH: Contains = PH; Origin = Greek; Word Length > 7.
- Latin TION: Ends With = TION; Word Length > 8.
- British OUR: Contains = OUR; use the relevant UK WordBanks.
- Championship remediation: Word Length >= 12; Status = INCORRECT.
- Foundation practice: Word Length <= 5; Status = UNATTEMPTED.

CHAPTER 5

Learning Modes

Move from understanding to guided practice, independent assessment and timed performance.

Learn Mode



Figure 5.1 - Learn Mode with complete word information, pronunciation, timer, upcoming words and learning controls.

- Listen to the word and pronunciation.
- Read the definition, sentence, part of speech and origin.
- Identify roots, prefixes, suffixes and rule patterns.
- Look away from the spelling and type the word from memory.
- Use Word Statistics later to move LEARNT words into testing.

Practice Mode



Figure 5.2 - Practice Mode uses an unscrambling activity and immediate correction to reinforce spelling patterns.

Practice Mode is a guided activity designed to strengthen visual memory, letter order and pattern recognition before the learner is assessed independently. The word is presented as an unscrambling activity: the learner rearranges or enters the letters to form the correct spelling and receives immediate feedback.

What Practice Mode Records

Event	Effect on statistics
A word is opened in Practice Mode	The word is no longer treated as completely untouched.
The learner completes the unscrambling activity	The word is marked PRACTISED.
The learner requires several attempts	The activity still provides guided reinforcement; it is not counted as an independent Test result.
The learner later enters Test Mode	The independent attempt can then become CORRECT or INCORRECT.

Recommended Practice Procedure

- Select a WordBank or apply Advanced Filter before opening Practice Mode.
- Listen to the word and review the pronunciation guide where available.
- Study the visible letter group and identify familiar prefixes, suffixes, roots or doubled letters.
- Unscramble the letters without rushing.
- Review the correction and compare the attempted order with the approved spelling.
- Repeat the activity with INCORRECT, LEARNT or UNATTEMPTED filtered words for targeted work.

When to Use Practice Mode

Scenario	Recommended use
A learner has just studied a rule	Practise only words from the selected rule WordBank.
A learner repeatedly confuses letter order	Use Contains, Starts With or Ends With filters to create a pattern-specific set.
A learner is not ready for independent testing	Use Practice before Test so correction remains immediate and supportive.
A tutor wants evidence of guided work	Use PRACTISED status and the session report alongside later Test results.

IMPORTANT DISTINCTION PRACTISED shows that the learner completed guided work. It does not mean the word was independently spelled correctly under Test conditions.

Test Mode measures what the learner can spell without seeing the approved spelling. The learner chooses the required number of words before starting. Each attempt is recorded as CORRECT or INCORRECT and contributes to the learner statistics stored for the signed-in Windows user.

- Maximum Words controls the test length.
- The configured timer applies per word where timing is enabled.
- The end-of-session report shows correct, incorrect, percentage, timing and each entered spelling.
- Use Advanced Filter after the test to isolate INCORRECT words and create a focused recovery session.

Individual Speed Round



Figure 5.5- Individual Speed Round. A learner hears words and types them while the entire round timer counts down.

Individual Speed Round is designed for personal competition preparation. The learner hears a sequence of words and types each spelling while one countdown controls the complete round. The timer is not restarted for each word.

Countdown Timer Behaviour

The timer remains visible throughout the round. When 30 seconds or less remains, the countdown display turns red to give the learner a clear visual warning that the round is nearing completion.

During the Round

- Listen to each word and type the spelling as quickly and accurately as possible.
- Submit the spelling and continue to the next word while time remains.
- Use the Speller or Audience display when practising with more than one monitor.
- Use a three-screen layout for a limited competition-style simulation where available.

End-of-Round Results

At the end of the Individual Speed Round, the result summary records the number of words attempted, the number spelled correctly and the time taken. These results help the learner compare speed and accuracy between repeated rounds.

Result	How to interpret it
Words Attempted	The total number of words reached during the round.
Words Correct	The number of submitted spellings that matched the approved spelling.
Accuracy	Correct words compared with words attempted.
Time Taken	The duration used to complete the recorded activity or the time available before the round ended.

PERFORMANCE PRINCIPLE A higher attempted-word total is useful only when accuracy remains strong. Track both speed and correctness when comparing rounds.

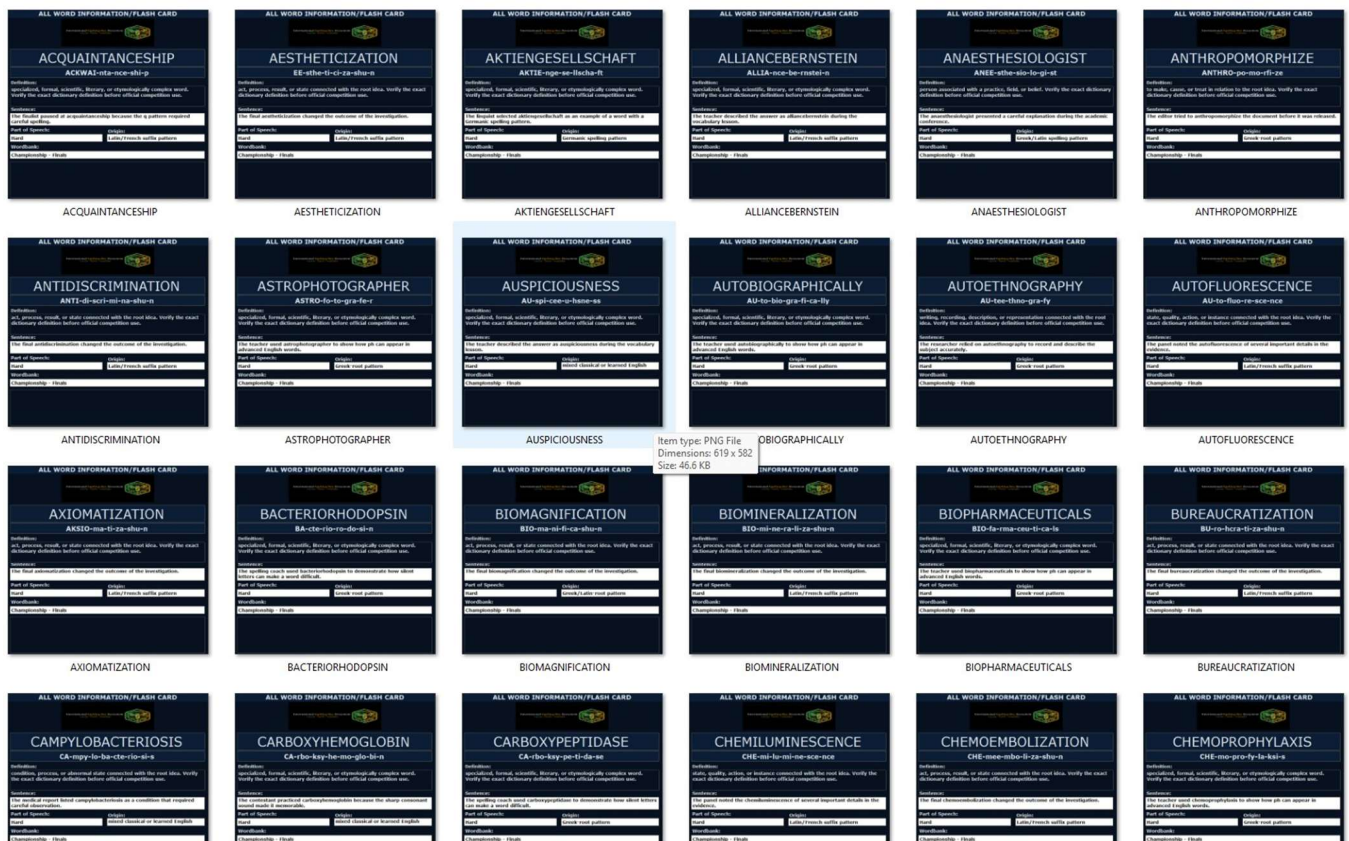


Figure 6.1 - Flashcards present words and supporting information for structured review.

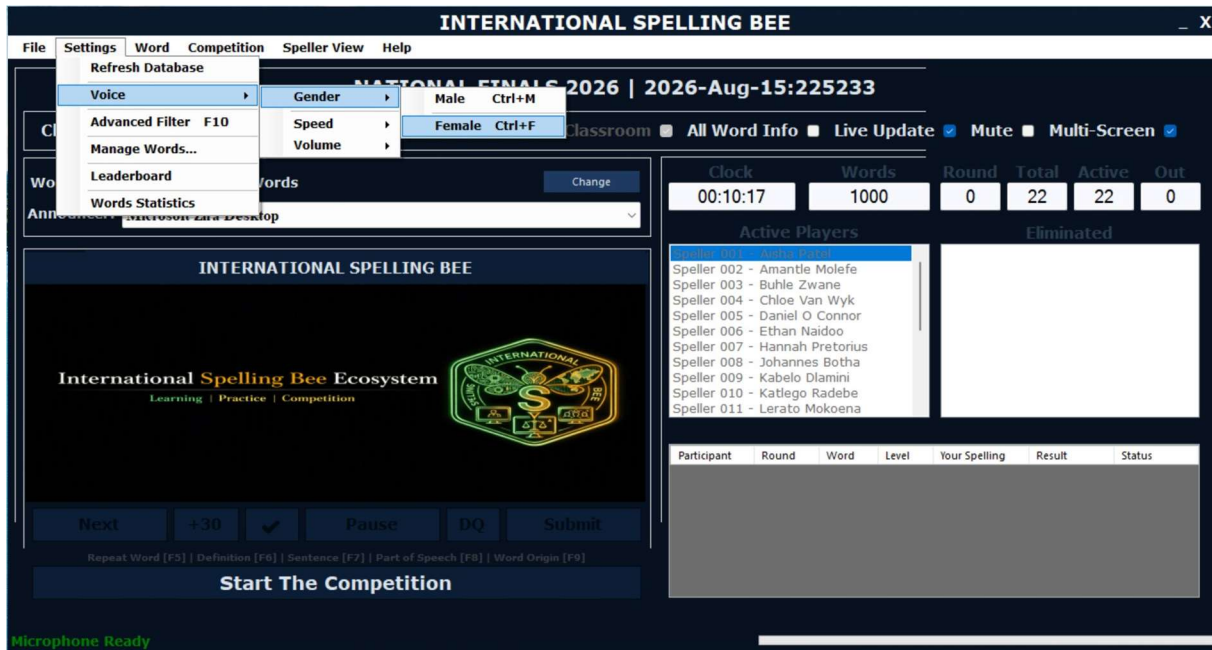


Figure 6.2 - Text-to-Speech and announcer settings support available Windows voices and multilingual delivery.

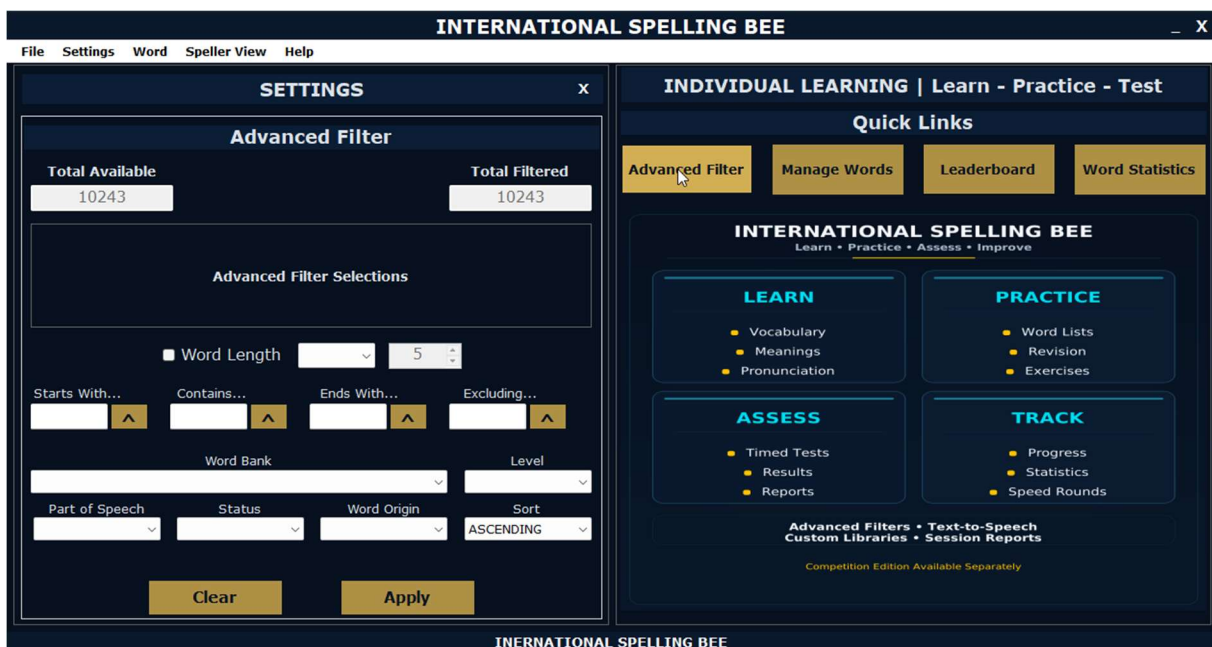


Figure 6.3 - Word Statistics summarise activity and provide quick access to Advanced Filter and targeted learning.

CHAPTER 7

Guidance for Learners, Parents, Teachers and Tutors

Practical recommendations for every person supporting a learner's preparation.

Learners

- Begin with Learn Mode before moving unfamiliar words into Practice and Test.
- Use INCORRECT status to avoid repeatedly studying already mastered words.
- Use Individual Speed Round to compare both attempted words and correct words over time.
- Study spelling rules and origins to recognise families of words.

Parents

- Import school lists into a dedicated WordBank.
- Use short, regular sessions rather than one long session.
- Review the session report and focus on the actual entered spelling.
- Use a separate Windows account when private learner-specific statistics are required.

Teachers

- Create WordBanks by class, grade, week, topic or spelling rule.
- Use Advanced Filter to differentiate study by word length, origin, status or pattern.
- Teach the rule first, then use Learn, Practice and Test as a structured sequence.
- Use reports to identify class-wide patterns and remediation needs.

Tutors

- Assess first, then create a targeted intervention from INCORRECT words.
- Combine status with Contains, Starts With, Ends With, origin and part of speech.
- Use repeated reports to show evidence of progress to parents.
- Move learners from guided Practice to independent Test and then timed Speed Round.

CHAPTER 8

Competition Preparation

Prepare approved words, participants, devices, displays and audio before the first live attempt.

Manual Participant Entry

- Select the total number of participants.
- Add each participant in the required competition sequence.
- Review names and optional display information before starting.
- Use Edit to correct participant information or order.

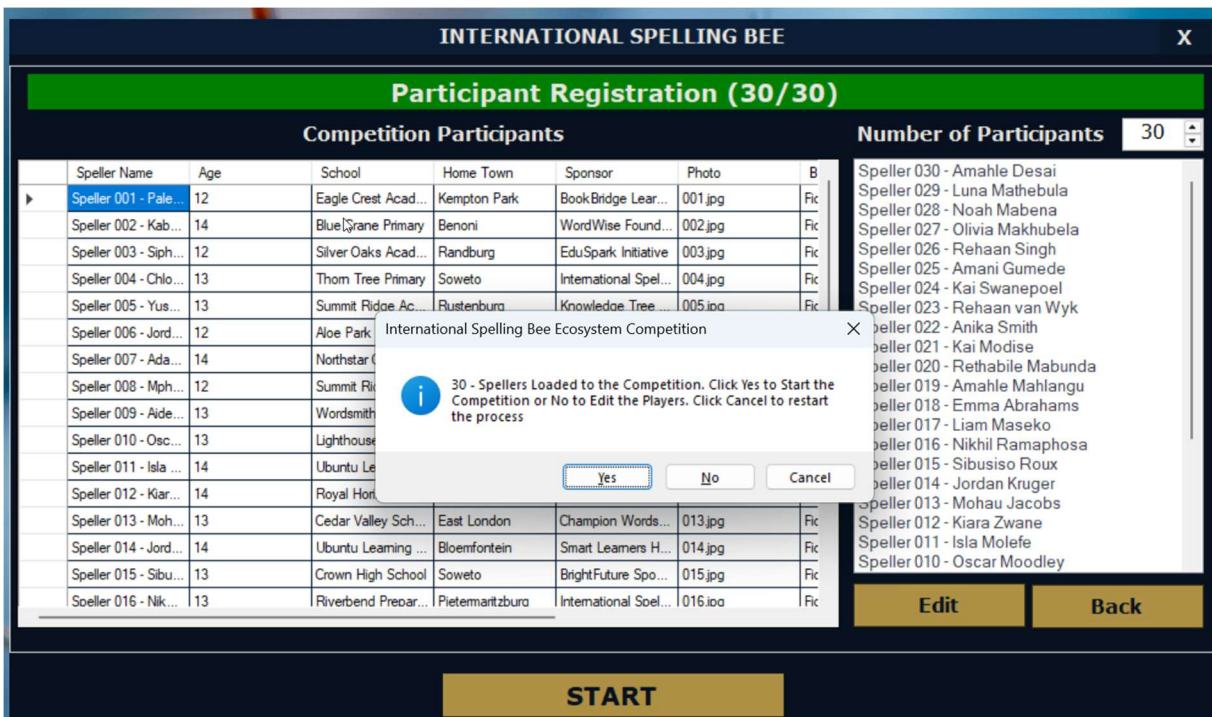


Figure 8.3 - Participant Registration. Review imported participants, assigned order and participant information before selecting Start.

Automatic Speller Sequence

Participant order is assigned during Participant Registration. Once the competition starts, the software selects each speller automatically in the assigned sequence and keeps that sequence for the remainder of the event.

- The adjudicator advances the competition and the next round with a button click.
- Eliminating and later reinstating a speller does not create a new sequence; the reinstated speller returns within the original order.
- If every active speller fails in the same round, all affected spellers are reinstated and competition continues in the original assigned sequence.
- Officials should verify the imported order before starting because the system uses that order automatically.

Configuring Three Extended Displays

- Use the laptop display plus two independent external displays through a docking station or suitable outputs.
- Set Windows to Extend these displays. Do not duplicate the displays.
- A recommended starting point is 1920 x 1200 resolution at 150% scaling; adjust to the venue and monitor size.
- The Audience Screen receives priority when additional monitors are detected.
- Select Speller View to show the Speller Screen.
- Double-click the Speller or Audience header to move that window to the next available display.
- If no additional monitor is detected, MultiScreen is cleared and disabled until a display is reconnected.

CHAPTER 9

Three-Screen Competition Architecture

Give officials, spellers and audiences purpose-built views of the same live event.

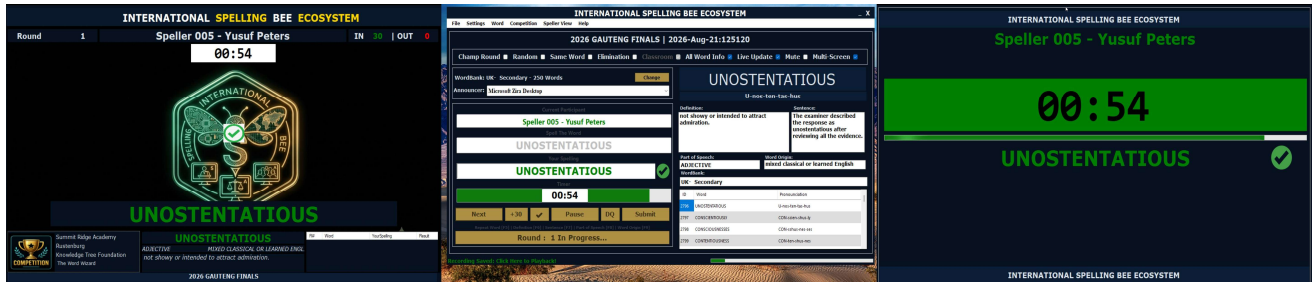


Figure 9.1 - Full three-screen competition architecture: Audience, Adjudicator and Speller views operating together.

Adjudicator Screen

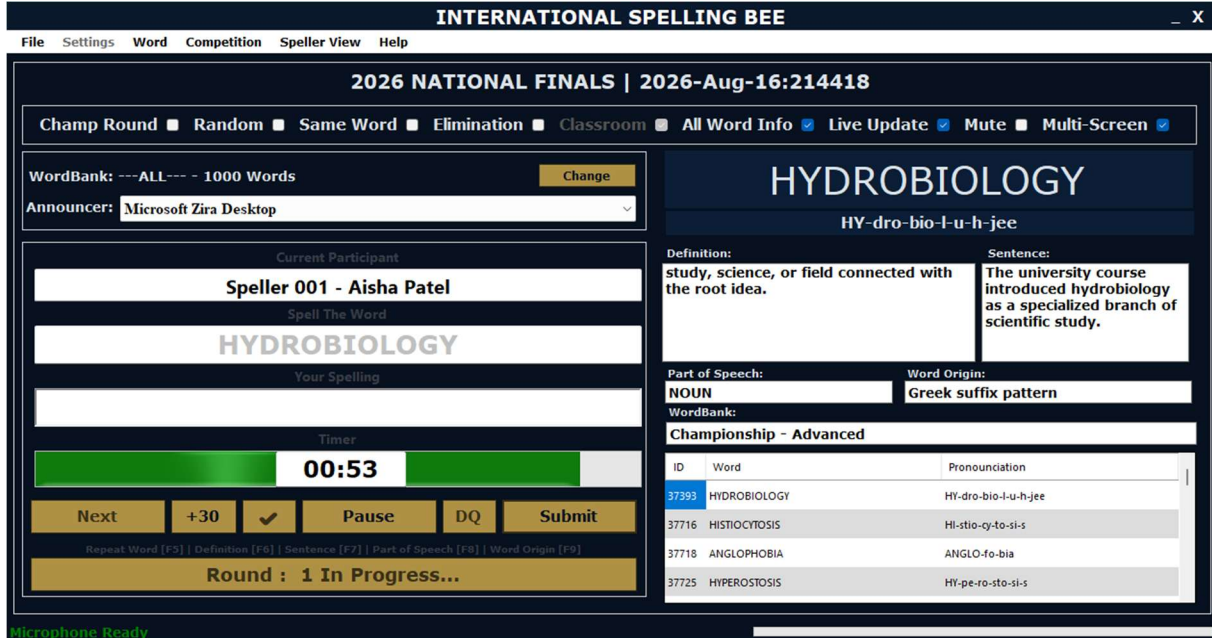


Figure 9.2 - Adjudicator Screen during a spelling attempt, with controls, live spelling, timer, word information and attempt history.

The adjudicator controls progression and captures the spelling. The operator may type the exact letters announced or use the applicable Correct or Incorrect decision control. All Word Information provides the pronunciation guide, definition, sentence, part of speech, origin, WordBank and upcoming words.

Speller Screen

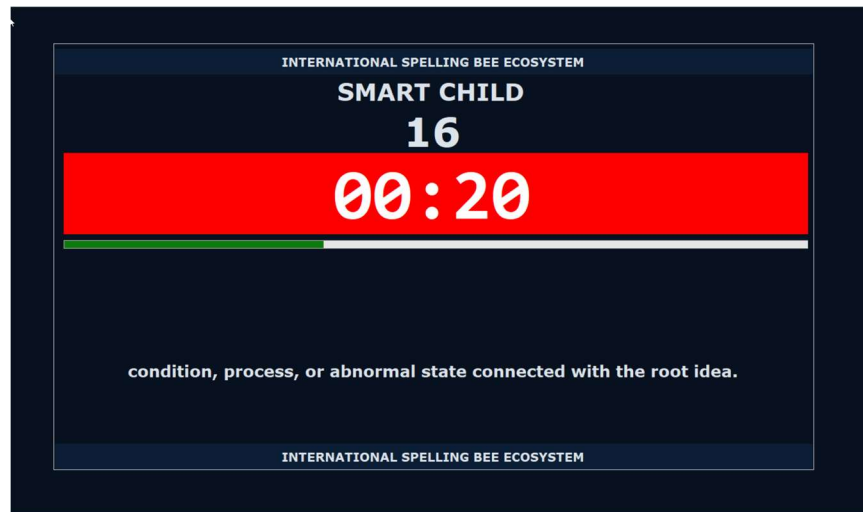


Figure 9.3 - Speller Screen used in a Speed Round and in competition, presenting the participant name, timer and/or masked definition.

The Speller Screen can show the participant name, countdown timer, definition and live letters according to the competition rules. During Competition Speed Round, the default display includes the name, timer and definition.

DEFINITION MASKING If the target word or a recognised plural appears in the definition, the software masks the word with asterisks. Organisers should still remove revealing wording during WordBank review.

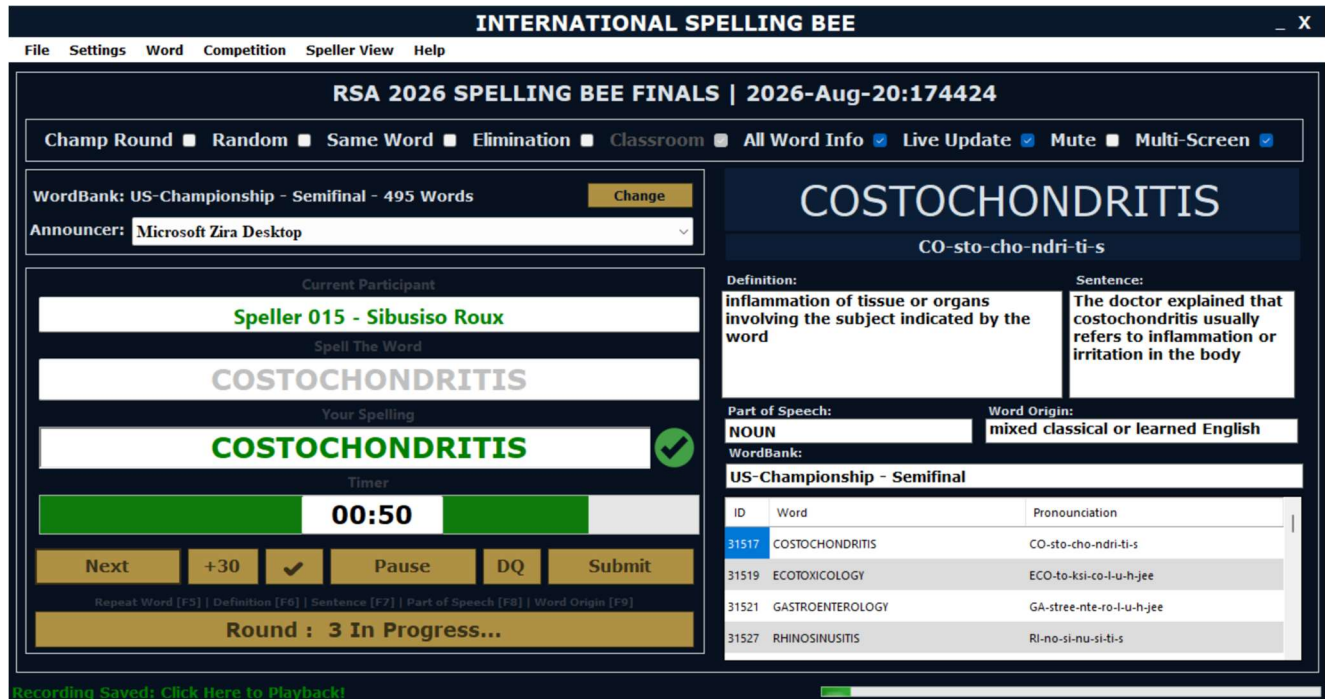


Figure 10.1 - Competition Mode control centre with progression, timing, decision, pause, disqualification and submission controls.

Round advancement is completed with a button click. Before advancing, verify active and eliminated totals, resolve eligible challenges and confirm the attempt history. The next round continues in the original participant sequence.

Competition Menu

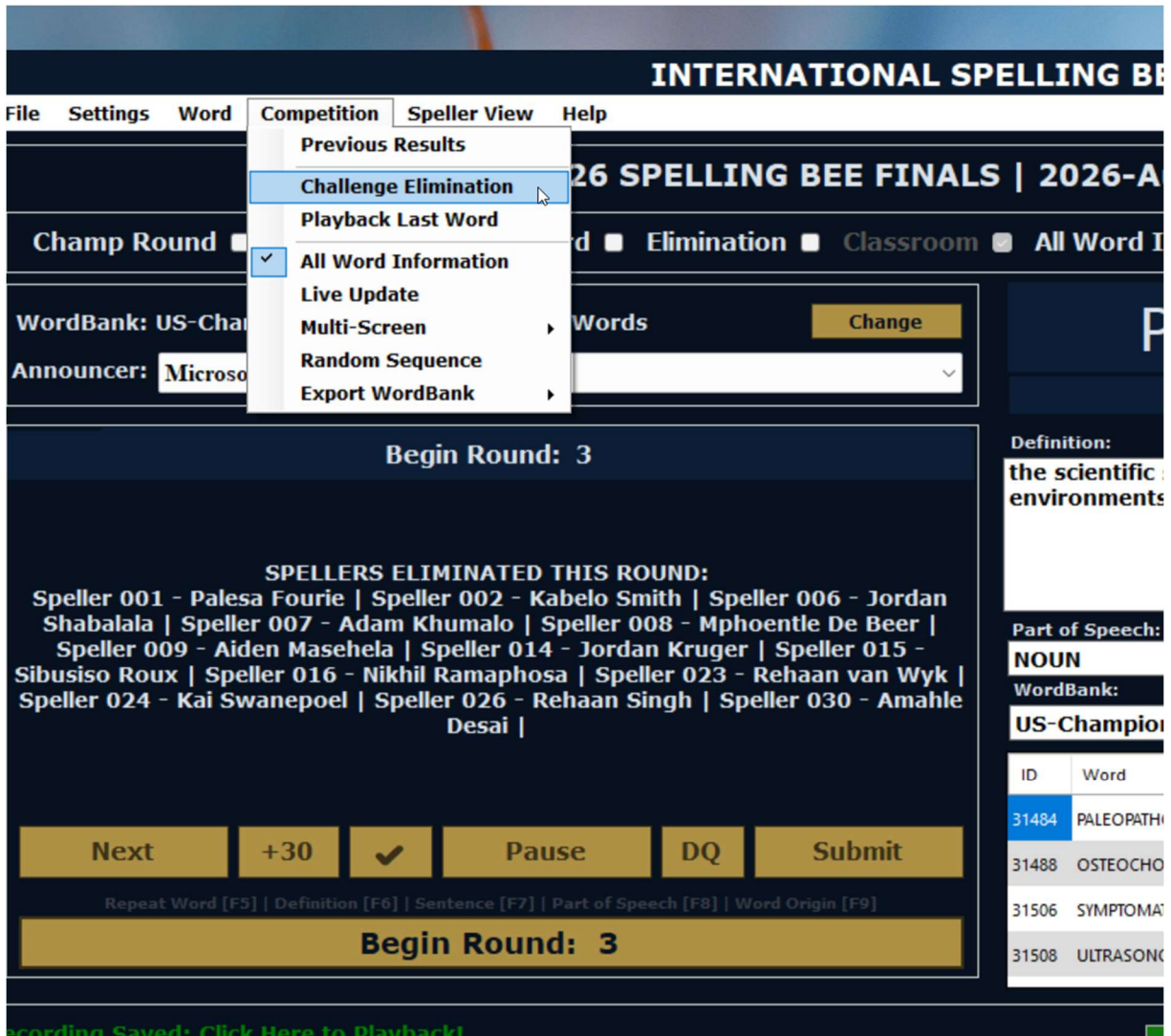


Figure 10.3 - Competition menu with Previous Results, Challenge Elimination, Playback Last Word, All Word Information, Live Update and Multi-Screen controls.

Pause, Disqualification and Challenge Elimination

Pause may be used for an alternative-spelling review, a different pronounced word, technical interference, authorised extra time, disqualification or an authorised correction. A disqualification is different from automatic elimination and requires a factual recorded reason.

- Pause the competition.
- Select DQ.
- Enter a concise factual reason.
- Confirm that the correct participant is referenced.
- Select OK and verify the updated competition state before resuming.

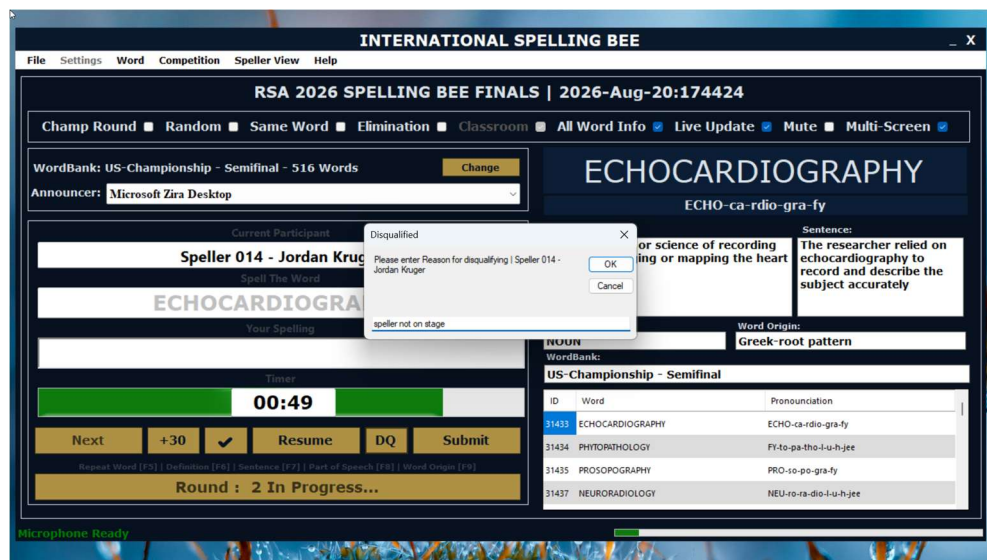


Figure 10.4 – Successful challenge, speller will now return to game and in the original spelling order.

A legitimate elimination challenge is handled at the end of the round. Competition > Challenge Elimination can restore only a speller whom the system eliminated during the round that has just concluded.

- Complete the current round.
- Review the challenge using the competition rules, attempt history and audio where required.
- Open Competition > Challenge Elimination.
- Select the eligible speller eliminated during the round that has just ended.
- Confirm the restoration and verify the active participant count.

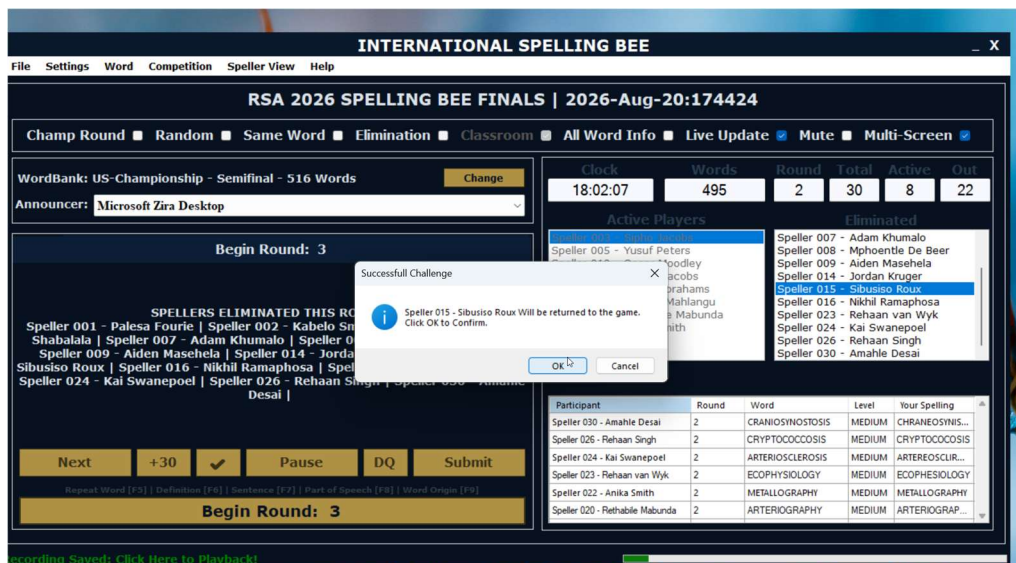


Figure 10.5 – Successful challenge, speller will now return to game and in the original spelling order.

RESTRICTION Challenge Elimination can restore only spellers whom the system eliminated during the round that has just concluded. It is not used for eliminations from earlier rounds.

CHAPTER 11

Competition Speed Round and Tie-Breakers

Use timed rounds for seeding, rapid assessment and championship tie-breakers.

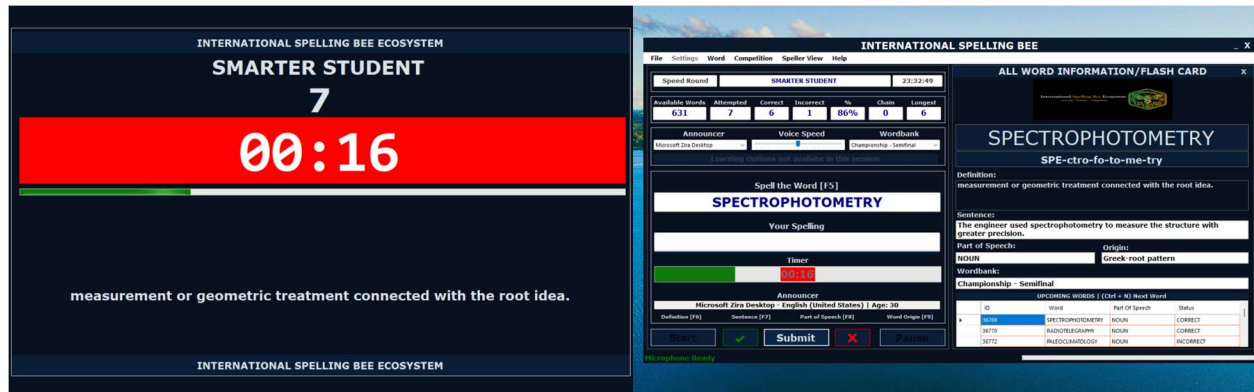


Figure 11.1 - Competition Speed Round using the three-screen environment and a single round timer.

How Competition Speed Round Works

The adjudicator may type the exact letters spoken by the speller or select Correct or Incorrect. Submitting an empty spelling textbox temporarily skips the current word. Skipped words return if time remains. The entire Speed Round is saved as one local audio file, identified using the speller and result information.

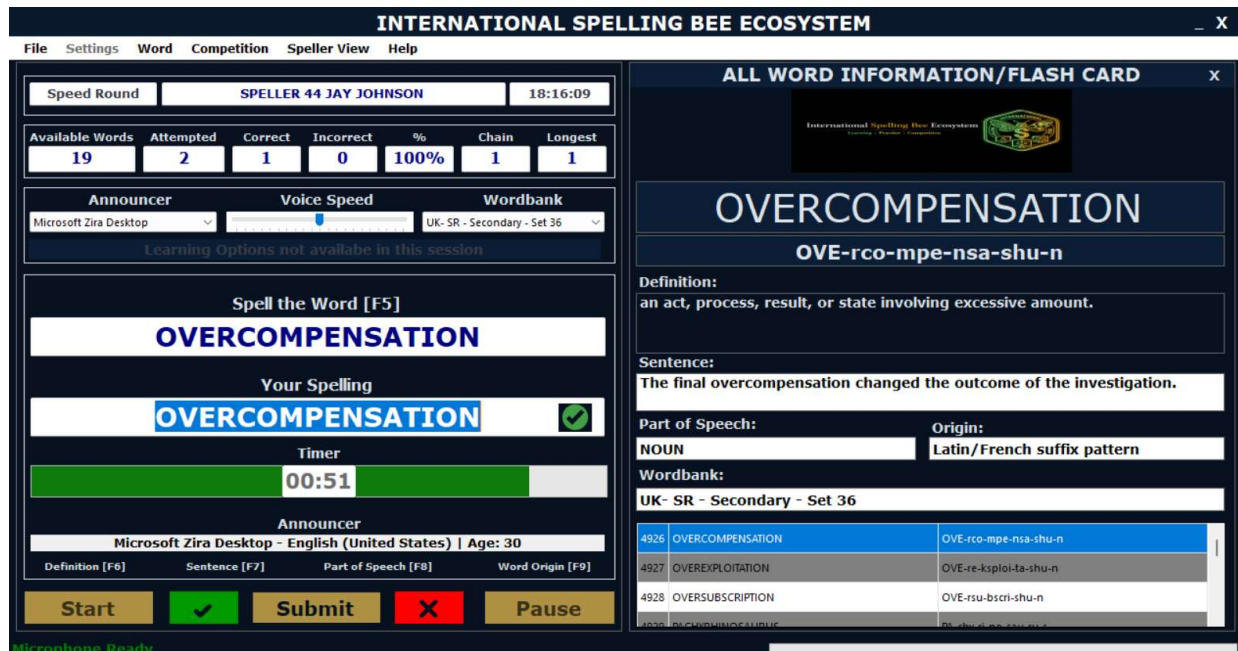


Figure 11.2 - Competition Speed Round using the three-screen environment and a single round timer.

Speller Screen Default During Competition Speed Round

By default, the definition is always shown on the Speller Screen during Competition Speed Round. If the actual target word appears in the definition, that word is replaced by asterisks so the definition does not reveal the spelling. A recognised plural form is also masked where applicable.

DATA QUALITY REMAINS ESSENTIAL Automatic masking is a safeguard, not a substitute for WordBank review. Organisers should still remove the target word and revealing variants from definitions before competition day.

Timer Warning

When 30 seconds or less remains, the Speed Round countdown turns red. The colour change gives the speller, adjudicator and relevant display viewers an immediate warning that the round is nearing completion.

Competition Speed Round Results

The end-of-round results identify the number of words attempted, the number spelled correctly and the time taken. The complete round audio is saved as one file rather than one recording per word.

Designing Fair Speed Round WordBanks

- For seeding, create a unique 10-word or 20-word WordBank for each speller.
- Use equal-sized lists of equivalent difficulty.
- Name each list clearly so its assigned speller and purpose are unambiguous.
- Test pronunciation guides, Text-to-Speech and word order before the event.
- For a final tie-breaker, use a longer list so finalists can spell as many words as possible in the allotted time.

Individual vs Competition Speed Round

Individual Learning Speed Round	Competition Speed Round
Learner hears and types successive words.	A live speller spells aloud while an adjudicator captures or judges the attempt.
Uses one timer for the complete round.	Uses formal competition timing, scoring and skipped-word return.

No competition recording workflow.	Full round audio, replay, results and reporting.

CHAPTER 12

Audio, Broadcasting and Sponsor Presentation

Create a professional event experience while preserving evidence and respecting privacy.

Audio Recording and Replay

Figure 12.1 - Microphone detection and live volume monitoring on the Competition start screen.

Competition Mode records the delivered word and the speller's announced spelling whether words are delivered by Text-to-Speech or a human pronouncer. A quick link makes the latest spelling immediately available for replay, while all recordings are retained in the competition-designated local folder.

Video and Livestreaming

The Audience Screen can display video from the built-in webcam or another compatible source connected to the competition computer. The complete Audience Screen can be captured by livestream software, combining video, live statistics, participant information and sponsor branding.

PRIVACY-CONTROLLED DISPLAY If participant photographs, age, school or biography cannot be shown to the venue or livestream audience, replace participant information with approved sponsor or event content.

CHAPTER 13

Previous Competitions and Comprehensive Reports

Preserve the complete competition story - from summary and champion to every individual spelling attempt.

Opening Previous Results

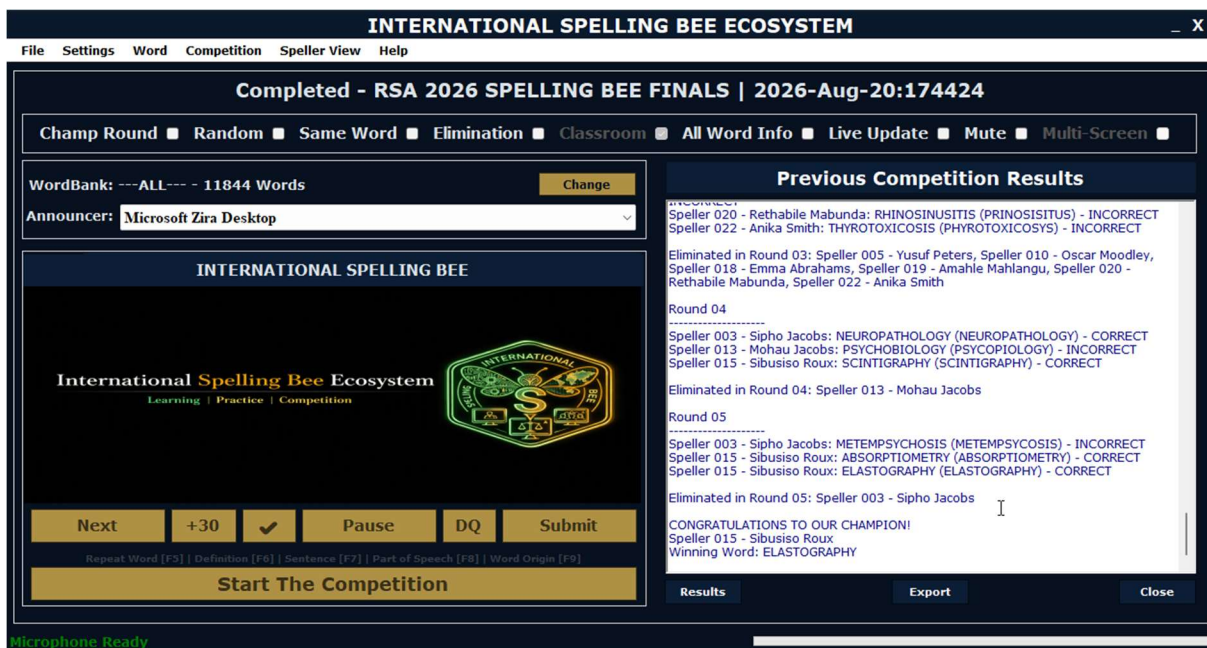


Figure 13.1 - Previous Competition Results with competition summary, placements, round outcomes and winning word.

- Select Resume Previous Competition on the start screen.
- Open Competition and select Previous Competition Results.
- Choose the required in-progress or completed competition.
- Use the same countdown setting used when the competition was created.
- Select Results for on-screen viewing or Export to create the comprehensive local report.
- Allow all participant pages to finish generating before closing.

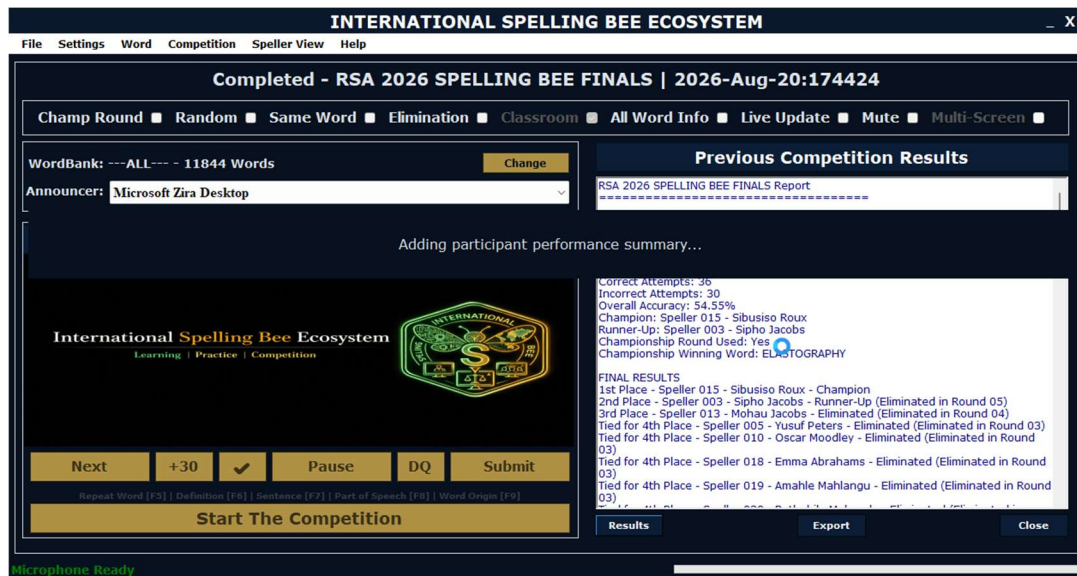


Figure 13.2 - Report-generation progress. Allow individual participant pages and summaries to finish before closing.

NO MICROSOFT WORD REQUIRED If Microsoft Word is not installed, the report can still be viewed on screen within the application. The file is saved locally before opening for verification.

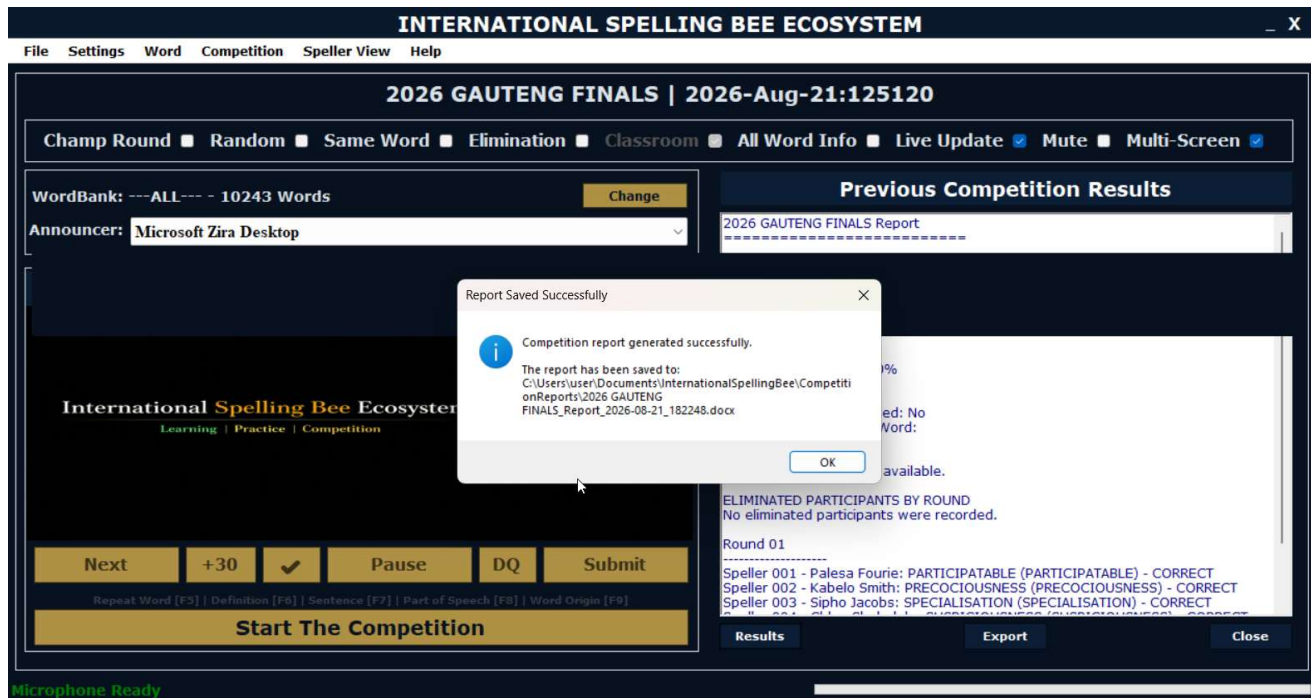


Figure 13.5 - Round results and eliminated-participant records in the exported report.

CHAPTER 14

Operational Checklists and Troubleshooting

Use concise checks to prepare, operate and close an event consistently.

Learning Data Quality Checklist

- Confirm the approved spelling variant.
- Add accurate definitions, sentences, pronunciation guides, origins and parts of speech.
- Remove duplicate and confusing alternative spellings.
- Test WordBanks in the intended learning mode.
- Use Advanced Filter and Word Statistics to verify target groups.

Competition Readiness Checklist

- Verify participant order and consent-controlled information.
- Confirm competition name, timer, delivery method and rules.
- Confirm Microphone Ready and movement on the volume meter.
- Test the three extended displays at the selected resolution and scaling.
- Verify Audience Screen privacy, video and sponsor settings.
- Test the approved WordBank and pronunciation guides.
- Confirm the report save location and available storage.

Common Issues

Issue	Action
No microphone found	Connect or enable the device and confirm Windows detects it.
Microphone ready but no volume movement	Check mute, gain and the selected Windows input.
Additional screen disappears	Reconnect the display; MultiScreen remains disabled until another monitor is detected.
Wrong display used	Double-click the Speller or Audience header, or use the Competition menu to move the screen.
Report does not open in Word	Use the in-app viewer; the locally saved report remains available.

Incorrect learner separation	Use separate Windows accounts; session names do not create separate databases.
Accidental database reset risk	Do not proceed until required reports and records have been retained.

CHAPTER 15

Frequently Asked Questions

Quick answers to the most common questions about the ecosystem.

Does entering a name create a permanent learner profile?

No. The name applies to the current session and is used primarily for the leaderboard.

How are learner statistics separated?

Statistics belong to the signed-in Windows user database. Use separate Windows accounts for private learner-specific data.

What happens if Spelling Level is left blank?

Learning continues normally. The setting is only used for leaderboard grouping.

Does Spelling Level select harder words?

No. WordBank and filter selection determine the actual words and difficulty.

Can the software operate in languages other than English?

Yes, when a validated word list and suitable Text-to-Speech voice or human pronouncer are available.

Why do some WordBanks start with UK or US?

The prefix identifies the main English spelling convention used in that WordBank.

Are the supplied 10,000+ words an official competition list?

No. They are starter content. Organisers must load and validate approved competition words.

Can unneeded WordBanks be deleted?

Yes, from Word Management.

What does Reset Database remove?

It clears progress, statistics and leaderboards. Competition Edition also loses existing, in-progress and completed competitions.

What is the difference between LEARNT and PRACTISED?

LEARNT comes from Learn Mode; PRACTISED comes from the guided unscrambling activity.

What makes a word CORRECT or INCORRECT?

An independent Test Mode attempt assigns CORRECT or INCORRECT.

What does the Advanced Filter do?

It creates a dynamic study set across one or multiple WordBanks using structure, origin, status and other criteria.

Can word length use ranges?

Yes. Use equal to, greater than, greater than or equal to, less than, or less than or equal to.

Why does the Speed Round timer turn red?

The timer turns red when 30 seconds or less remains to warn that the round is nearing completion.

What does the Individual Speed Round result show?

Words attempted, words correct and time taken.

Is the definition always shown during Competition Speed Round?

Yes, by default the definition is shown on the Speller Screen.

What if the target word appears in the definition?

The target word is replaced by asterisks. Organisers should still remove revealing wording during review.

How are leaderboard positions calculated?

Highest correct-word total first, then highest correct percentage from words attempted.

How are competition spellers selected?

Automatically in the participant sequence assigned at registration.

Does reinstatement change the sequence?

No. A reinstated speller returns within the original order.

What happens if every speller fails in the same round?

The affected spellers are reinstated and continue in the original sequence.

How is the next round started?

The adjudicator advances the round with the applicable button after reviewing the end-of-round state.

What is Challenge Elimination?

An end-of-round function that restores an eligible speller eliminated during the round that just ended.

Is disqualification the same as elimination?

No. Disqualification is an exceptional official action that requires a recorded reason.

Is a separate microphone test required?

Normally no. Microphone Ready plus a moving volume meter confirms incoming audio.

What if the microphone is detected but the meter does not move?

Check mute, gain and the selected Windows input device.

Does manual word delivery disable recording?

No. Competition audio is recorded whether Text-to-Speech or a human pronouncer delivers the word.

How is Competition Speed Round audio saved?

The complete round is saved as one audio file, not one file per word.

Can the Audience Screen show live video?

Yes, using the built-in webcam or another compatible connected source.

Can participant details be hidden?

Yes. Replace restricted participant information with approved sponsor or event content.

Can reports be viewed without Microsoft Word?

Yes. The application includes an on-screen report viewer.

Why must the same timer be used when resuming?

The resumed competition must use the original timing configuration to continue consistently.

How should Speed Round seeding lists be prepared?

Create equivalent unique 10-word or 20-word WordBanks for each speller.

What should be used for a final Speed Round tie-breaker?

Use a longer WordBank so finalists can spell as many words as possible in the allotted time.

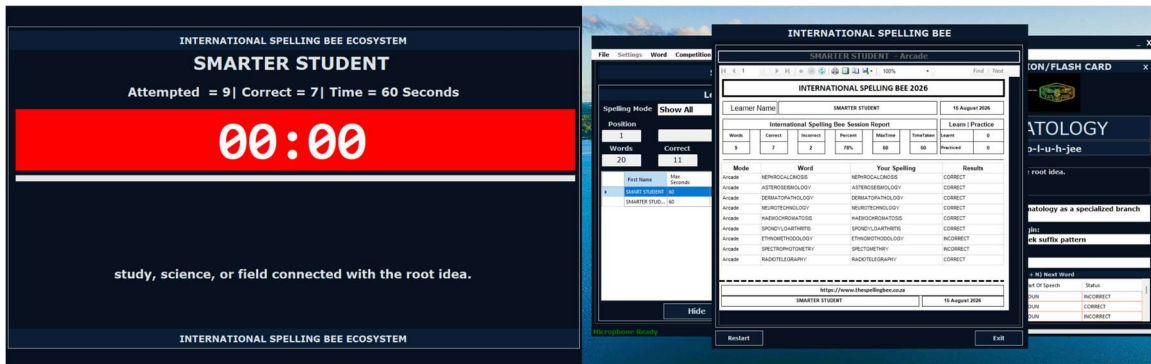
